The successful candidate will have a sound track record in writing and developing USG proposals, including experience writing and developing complex proposals from start to finish. The Proposal Writer must be self-driven, highly organized, able to juggle multiple priorities at the same time and manage the entire proposal development process.

#### Tasks in addition to proposal writing include, but are not limited to:

- Collecting needed data and information, mapping existing projects and organizations, and establishing measures for success in proposal development;
- Analysing new opportunities as they come out;
- Carrying out all needed steps to develop highly competitive strategies for opportunities;
- Developing teaming agreements with partners;
- Preparing for and participating in relevant donor, partner and stakeholder meetings;
- For approved proposals, preparing handover documents about the approved activity. Supporting and following up during the 3-month start-up period to ensure a successful hand-over from proposal to project teams and write or qualify project progress reports.
